

CPPTA abstract sample and guidelines

Selection of the works accepted for presentation at the conference will be based on their abstracts. An abstract is required for each conference presentation (this applies to the poster presentations as well). The deadline for abstract submissions is May 5th, 2025. The corresponding authors will be notified about the acceptance by June 1st, 2025.

With the submission of an abstract the author confirms that he/she and all co-authors:

- agree to the content of the abstract and approve its submission,
- release the copyright to CPPTA and give permission for the abstract, when accepted for presentation, to be published in the book of abstract as well as on the CPPTA website.

The abstract length must not exceed single A4 page. Use Times New Roman throughout the abstract. The abstract must contain the title of the presentation, names of the authors, their affiliations and the email address of the corresponding author. Guidelines for the preparation of the abstracts and Word sample/template can be downloaded from the conference website (www.cppta.eu). All abstracts must be submitted through the CPPTA website as DOC (MS Word) files (other file formats will not be accepted).

The abstract should be prepared according to the following requirements:

- All the margins should be set to 2.54 cm (1 inch)
- Use 12 pt. bold Times New Roman font for the title and 11 pt. regular Times New Roman for all the remaining text
- Center the abstract header (title, author names, affiliations, email). Use full justification for body text of the abstract and references
- Leave a single space line after the title, author names, and list of their affiliations
- Leave two space lines after the email address of the corresponding author
- Do not indent paragraphs
- Use a single space line after each paragraph
- The abstract may contain tables, equations, figures, references, etc.
- Avoid use of bitmap images if possible (use vector graphics instead)
- References (if any) should be numbered and formatted as in the example below
- Do not use spacing between references
